- **Pause to reflect at 4:30pm**, along with other Cubs Scouts from across Warwickshire, at what would have the half-way point of the camp - we'll post something to watch live on our youtube channel:

There are four things to do to earn your International Activity Badge.

1. Draw or create the World Scout Badge at Home

You can draw or paint it, make it out of recycling, make it out of sticks from your garden, build it out of Lego, or just about anything! Identify the different parts and what they mean. There is some information later in this pack.

2. Make a famous landmark out of recycling

Turn your recycling into a famous landmark, and find out some facts about the country it is in. This could be somewhere you have been, or somewhere you'd like to go. Your facts could be about the language, currency, culture or Scouting. (Did you know Beavers Scouts in Australia are called Joeys!)

3. Try some food from around the world

Get your taste buds at the ready and learn about some food from around the world in this global gastro gathering. Some ideas are:

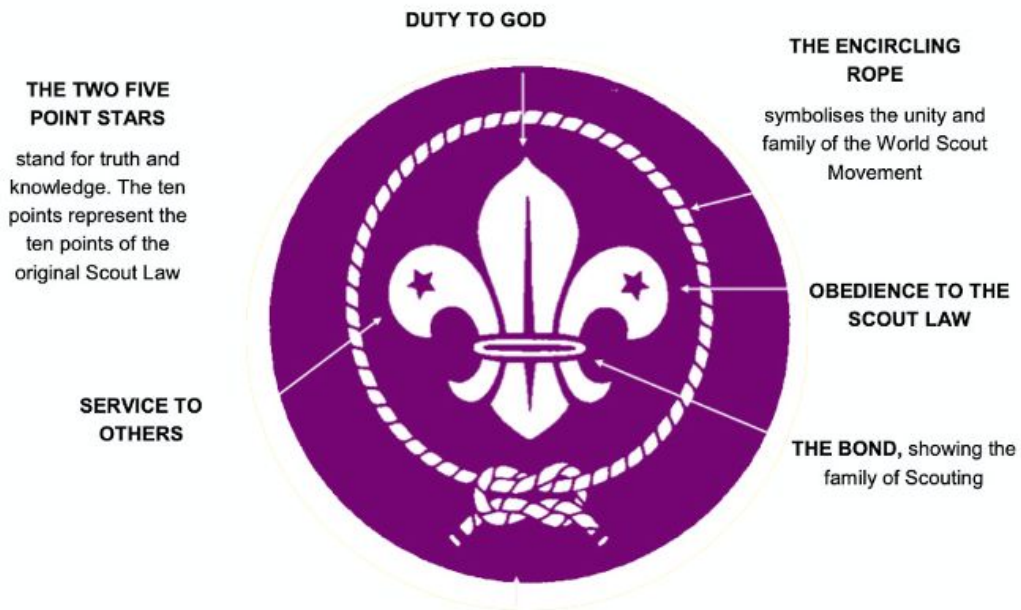
- Croissant, madeleine cakes, brie, or camembert cheese from France.

THE REEF KNOT which can't be undone no matter how hard it is pulled, is symbolic of the strength of world scouting's unity and family

Making the World Scout Badge out of Lego - an idea



To make the lego model exactly as it appears in the picture you will need:

1 lego base board minimum 25 spots by 28 spots and the following lego bricks:

1 x 1 = 18

1 x 2 = 22

1 x 3 = 17

1 x 4 = 18

1 x 6 = 2
